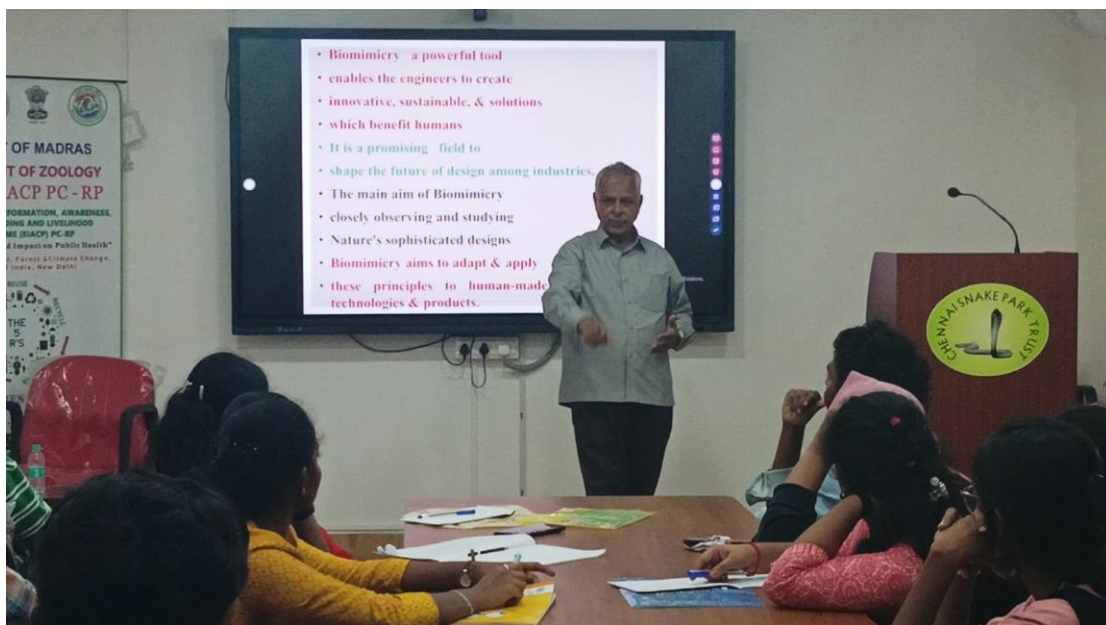
TRUST MEETING :

STANDARD OPERATIONAL PROCEDURE – SNAKE RESCUE

Chennai Snake Park conducted one day workshop for NGO's in Tamil Nadu in total 15 NGO's all over from Tamil Nadu were attended the workshop. In consultation with NGO's Chennai Snake Park prepared SOP for snake rescue.

1.Safety First: Prioritize the safety of both humans and snakes.

Conservation Focus: Aim to minimize harm and relocate snakes to suitable habitats.

11. Call Handling and Assessment:

Call Reception:

- Calls should ideally be received or communicated through the Forest Department.
- In emergency situations, inform the department before proceeding.

Caller Management:

- Calm the caller and gather information about the snake's location, size, and appearance.
- Request clear photographs of the snake and/or the area from a safe distance whenever possible.

Advise the caller to:

- Maintain a safe distance.
- Avoid chasing, disturbing, or attempting to capture the snake.
- Refrain from using fluids, hot water, or smoke to lure the snake.

Situation Assessment:

- Evaluate the necessity of a rescue.
- Snakes in open areas may not require rescue; advise the caller to allow the snake to move on.
- If the snake is inside a building or compound, instruct the caller to observe its movements from a safe distance while awaiting rescuer arrival.

III. Rescue Operations:

Equipment Preparation:

- Essential equipment: snake bag, snake hook (no tongs), PVC pipe, secure transportation container, boots, full-sleeved clothing, and flashlights (for night rescues).
- Always carry a partner.

On-Site Procedures:

- Ensure a safe and undisturbed rescue area.
- Set up the snake bag in a secure location.
- Identify the snake species (if possible) before handling.
- If identification is uncertain, treat the snake as venomous and use hooks for safety.
- Employ appropriate bagging techniques, avoiding methods that could injure the snake (no squeezing in plastic containers).
- Use the bag to guide the snake inside, avoid using the bag to directly catch the snake. Reverse bagging is only for nonvenomous species.
- Minimize handling time (less than 5 minutes).
- No public display of the snake.
- Secure the bagged snake immediately for transportation

Night Rescues:

- Exercise extra caution and utilize adequate lighting.
- Partner is mandatory.

IV. Post-Rescue Procedures:

Data Collection:

- Record the date, time, location, species, size, and any injuries or abnormalities.
- Take a photograph of the snake.
- Submit all data to the Forest Department.

- **Snake Handling:**

- Consult with the Forest Department or a government veterinarian regarding any observed abnormalities.
Hand over injured or weak snakes to the department for treatment or release after consultation.

Release:

- Release snakes in designated forest areas, ensuring appropriate habitat selection (aquatic, terrestrial, or arboreal) as advised by the forest department
- Only release the snake at the release point.

Community Awareness:

- I. Panchayat wise villages to be listed and awareness program should be conducted to 100 day workers, government, aided and private school, colleges.
 - II. Must display snake bite first aid posters at Rural and Urban Primary health centres, taluk hospitals, Government, and private hospitals.
 - III. Theatres, Bus stands, airports, railway station can play or install hoarding awareness clips or boards.
- Snake behaviour and safety.
 - Building security measures.
 - Proper waste disposal to deter rodents.
 - Snakebite first aid.
 - Forest Department contact information

DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

During the December,2025, the Park had 35,005 Visitors (27,107 Adult and 7,898 Children).
